We are fortunate to have two assistants working with Sharon Ryan, our reading specialist. Both Jenny Gulliver and Joanne Wiggins are returning to work with Sharon and the students in the reading room.

McCarthy-Towne is a bustling place again. After a 10 week vacation, the school is filled with students, faculty and staff, parents, and visitors. I can feel the excitement and energy in the air and realize how happy we all are to be here. For those of us who work in schools, September is the first month of the year. 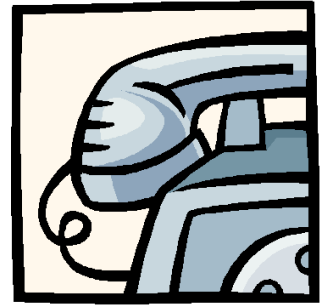

Safe Arrival Explained

Did you ever wonder how the McCarthy-Towne Safe Arrival system works?

Every morning after the start of the school day (8:30 AM this year), teachers take attendance and send attendance lists to the school office. A parent volunteer goes through the attendance lists, notes the absences, and then listens to the Safe Arrival answer machine messages. The volunteer reconciles the absentee list, the answer machine list and any late arrival check-ins. Then the volunteer tries to reconcile any students who are unaccounted for.

First the classroom teacher is called to confirm the absence; then parents are called (at home/work/cellphone) in the order specified on the Emergency Cards filled out at the beginning of the year; and then emergency contacts (relatives/neighbors/friends) as specified on the card are called.

Most of the time, all of the students are quickly accounted for. Occasionally the Safe Arrival volunteer has to do some extensive calling to determine that a family has forgotten to inform the school of an absence or late arrival. On very rare occasions, a child does not make it to school without the parent's knowledge. Luckily, these incidents have always had happy endings and have reinforced the importance and effectiveness of the Safe Arrival program.

The PTSO sponsors the Safe Arrival program by paying for a special phone line and scheduling volunteers to run it. Please help it function smoothly by remembering to call - day or night - when you know your child will be absent from school or late arriving in school.

Tidbits from Tina

As I search bookstores for resources on parenting, I am drawn to a book by Jane Nelsen, Positive Discipline A-Z: 1001 Solutions to Everyday Parenting Problems. Her extremely practical advice is based on a philosophy of child rearing that is positive, with an emphasis on a balance of firmness and kindness, and it works! Dr. Nelsen bases her suggestions on twenty-seven tools of parenting, as she calls them. She describes each tool in the first section of this book and then addresses 93 specific parenting problems in Part II. This year in "Tidbits from Tina" I will summarize Dr. Nelsen's tools, one at a time, so that parents can build their own tool kits of parenting. For those of you who can't stand the suspense and want to jump ahead, feel free to purchase your own copy of the book. While it's tempting to leap to the second section, searching for the solution to a particular problem you are having with your child, I strongly encourage you to carefully read and absorb Part I first. The tools she presents are key to successfully implementing her later suggestions. And so we begin. . .

Tool #1: Be Kind and Firm

Dr. Nelsen describes three parenting styles: #1-- The Boss; #2--Milquetoast; and #3-- Kind and Firm. The Boss is the parent who has all the power and wants the child simply to obey, since the adult knows best. He/She relies on punishment to control the child. The child learns to depend on the parent to make all the decisions, not feeling confident to decide for him/herself. Milquetoast parents tend to be overprotective, and they feel sorry for their children if something doesn't go well. These parents don't let their children learn from their mistakes and their children don't develop the belief that they are capable. Children of "milquetoast parents" tend to be selfish and irresponsible. A Kind and Firm parent is proactive—observing and thinking before acting. He/She models appropriate problem-solving rather than blaming others, and allows his/her children to suffer the consequences of their decisions. Those children learn to cope and to have confidence in themselves to solve problems.

Recycling Fundraiser Continues, With New Items Eligible!

Do you have old cell phones or printer cartridges? Been collecting them all summer? Now is the time to bring them in to the school office or the bin at the library! McCarthy-Towne sends them in to a recycling program and earns money for them. Last year the PTSO received about \$800 from its cartridge and phone recycling program. And now, we are adding new items to recycle! In addition to cell phones, inkjet and laser cartridges, we are now collecting unwanted DVD movies, DVD video games, portable DVD players, laptop and notebook computers (but no desktop computers), MP3 players, video game consoles, digital cameras, digital picture frames, and portable navigation & GPS devices. It doesn't matter whether they are working or not; we receive something for every item (although more for working items!).

Scrip Gift Card Program

Welcome back to another school year! We will once again be running the Scrip Gift Card Program on a monthly basis. With this program, McT families are able to help raise money needed for the PTSO, which pays for our assistant teachers, without having to purchase anything in addition to their usual shopping.

Just shop as you normally would on a regular basis, but instead of paying with cash or credit card at checkout, pay with your gift cards. Do you shop at Roche Bros. or Stop and Shop weekly? Do you pick up your pharmaceutical needs at CVS? Do you stop at Dunkin Donuts or Starbucks? Do you shop at The Gap, Land's End or TJ Maxx for clothes? Sure you do! Well, why not let McT earn a percentage of what you spend?

Did you know – if each of our 300 families purchased just a \$100 in gift cards a month – for example \$50 a month to Roche Bros. and \$50 a month to CVS – we would bring in \$750 a month, which would be \$7,500 a year. Yes, \$7,500 a year in additional funds to McT, just from our families shopping and dining as usual! Do you know how many more assistants' hours we could get a week for that?

Start Collecting Your Donelan's Supermarket Receipts!

The Register Tapes for Education Program was so successful last year that Donelan's Supermarkets will be participating in it again this year! With this program, your grocery receipts help our school! For every dollar spent, McT will earn points redeemable for free educational equipment, including art supplies and books.

Last year, McCarthy-Towne collected over \$72,000 in receipts which translated into over 72,000 points.
