Placement conversation will soon be taking place and I thought I'd repeat what was said last year at this time. As always, our goal is to make the best possible placements for our students. We believe that the best way to do this is to create heterogeneous and balanced classes. Creating these groupings

for each grade level is a complex process. Our entire professional staff spends a great deal of time carefully weighing each student's academic, social, and emotional needs as well as more individual issues such as those regarding particular peer relationships, neighborhood situations, or siblings' experiences. The sending and receiving teachers and the special education specialists meet as a team to create three balanced classes. The last part of the process is to assign a teacher to each of the classes that has been created. That is something that I do, late in the summer, after the spate of new families moving in and some current families moving out has ended. It is a numbers game, too, as we seek relative balance in this arena. Each teacher brings a unique style to the classroom, thus ensuring a variety of teaching strategies within the framework of the curriculum and the philosophy of the school. But in recent years a number of parents have chosen to write letters requesting their child be placed or not placed in a specific teacher's room or with or not with particular children. We cannot honor these requests. Families should be also be aware that your letters are always shown to the teachers at both the sending and receiving grade levels. In today's world, it is important that our students learn to relate to many different people. We hope that you will support your child as they discover how to work, and work well, with a broad range of students and teaching styles. We believe that this is an important part of your child's education. If you do choose to write me a letter, please do so by Thursday, April 17, right before we go on vacation.

Please remember, the next time the Bulletin comes out, there will flowers blooming, the air will be warm and filled with the sound of the peepers! Spring always does arrive, even if it feels unlikely right now...



Fifth Disease

Spring usually brings about a few cases of fifth disease. What is it? It is a mild childhood illness that causes a rash. It is called "Fifth disease" because it was the fifth of a group of similar rash illnesses to be described. (Rubella, measles and scarlet fever are also in this group).

It is caused by a parvovirus that lives in the nose and throat and can be spread from person to person. The virus usually occurs in 3 stages:

- The first stage consists of mild headache, body ache, sore throat, and low-grade fever. This stage lasts 2–3 days. During this stage the virus may be spread to others. The symptoms are often very mild and may not be noticed at all.
- The second stage last about a week and most children have no symptoms at all during this time.
- The third stage involves a bright red rash on the cheeks, which gives a "slapped cheek" appearance. This is followed by a "lacy" rash on the chest, back and arms. The rash may appear on and off for several weeks with changes in temperature, sunlight, and emotional stress. The appearance of this rash is how Fifth Disease is diagnosed. By the time the rash appears and the diagnosis is made, children are no longer contagious so there is no need to exclude them from school. Adults may not develop the third-stage rash but may experience joint pain, particularly in the hands and feet.

The disease is usually mild, and both children and adults recover without problems. There is no specific treatment for Fifth Disease. Health care providers may suggest treatment to relieve some symptoms. There is no vaccine to prevent Fifth Disease. In rare situations some people, especially those with blood disorders or weakened immune systems or women who are pregnant, may be at risk for complications and should notify their health care providers about possible exposure to the virus.
