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## Springing into April

Difficult as it may be to believe, we have had four snow days this year, the same number as last year. The intensity and timing of the storms this year have been very different, of course, but we are still very fortunate to have not lost more school days. There is still plenty of snow on the ground, though, making for messy hallways and wet children at recess. But the days are warming up, however slowly, and I hear the doves in the morning now, and that's always a positive sign. Even if this winter appears endless, we all know that the arrival of spring is inevitable, even as patience is wearing very thin!

The McCarthy-Towne Auction took place this past weekend and it could not have been more successful, in my view. The dedication of the parent community to the school is nothing short of remarkable and the generosity allows us, as a school, to make many different choices in terms of classroom support. But the Auction evening itself is also fun; it is a celebration of our community and of the students and teachers and staff that make up our school. Thank you to all of the people who worked so hard to make this event the huge success that it always is. Thanks to the PTSSO Co-Chairs Shelly Drouin and Julie Weir, the Auction Co-Chairs Christine Russell and Sam Valente-Phillips, who did an absolutely amazing job! Placement conversation will soon be taking place and I thought I'd repeat what was said last year at this time. As always, our goal is to make the best possible placements for our students. We believe that the best way to do this is to create heterogeneous and balanced classes. Creating these groupings for each grade level is a complex process.

Our entire professional staff spends a great deal of time carefully weighing each student's academic, social, and emotional needs as well as more individual issues such as those regarding particular peer relationships, neighborhood situations, or sibling experiences. The sending and receiving teachers and the special education specialists meet as a team to create three balanced classes. The last part of the process is to assign a teacher to each of the classes that has been created. That is something that I do, late in the summer, after the spate of new families moving in and some current families moving out has ended. It is a numbers game, too, as we seek relative balance in this arena. Each teacher brings a unique style to the classroom, thus ensuring a variety of teaching strategies within the framework of the curriculum and the philosophy of the school. But in recent years a number of parents have chosen to write letters requesting their child be placed or not placed in a specific teacher's room or with or not with particular children. We cannot honor these requests. Families should be also be aware that your letters are always shown to the teachers at both the sending and receiving grade levels. In today's world, it is important that our students learn to relate to many different people. We hope that you will support your child as they discover how to work, and work well, with a broad range of students and teaching styles. We believe that this is an important part of your child's education. If you do choose to write me a letter, please do so by Thursday, April 17, right before the break week.

Please remember, the next time this Bulletin comes out, there will flowers blooming, and the air will be warm and filled with the sound of the peepers! Spring always does arrive, even if it feels unlikely right now...

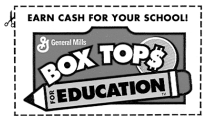

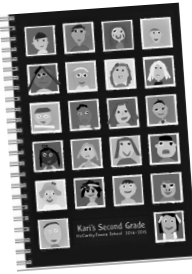

## McT Mileage Club Back in Action... Maybe by May Day?

For those of you familiar with the McT Mileage Club, **we plan to resume our workouts on May Day, May 1st** (assuming by then we will be able to see some ground out there.) An email will be coming soon with important reminders and details. For those who have no idea what the McT Mileage Club is... read on!

The McT Mileage Club is a morning exercise program for McT students along with parents who wish to join in the fun. The group is heading into its sixth session (Fall and Spring for the third year!) and is led by Chris Hanlon, McT parent, and Dave James, McT's P.E. teacher. Using a measured course in the back playground, McT Milers will log laps by running, jogging, walking, skipping, strolling (or some combination of those). They will use a chart to track their mileage and will receive an honorary foot token at certain accumulated distances. McT Mileage Club is a free program that operates on a drop-in basis. Come as often as you can, but there does not have to be an "every week" commitment. Here are the details:

**When:** Friday mornings, 8:30–9:05 AM, beginning on May 1st until the end of the school year.

**Where:** Back playground, Parker Damon Building

**What to bring:** Shoes comfortable for activity and a great attitude. A bottle of water is a good idea, as is a small snack to have on the walk to the front of school.

**How do I get involved:** Parents need to complete a form for each child participating in McT Mileage Club. Forms are available in the office and at the Mileage Club meetings. We rely on help from parent volunteers, so if you are available and want to come out and pitch in, you can volunteer as often as you like (weekly, bi-weekly, monthly, only when the weather is nice!)
