Although that bit of snow is already gone from where I sit and write this, that cold and snowy beginning to our Thanksgiving break last week was probably a portent of things to come. Now that it is December, we can really prepare ourselves for the real winter.

We are also just about one third of our way through the school year and we are noticing and tracking how the children are changing, too. Conferences are, for the most part, recently completed. Families and teachers have been able to sit down and speak to the learning that is happening in the McCarthy-Towne classrooms. One of the extraordinary parts of this school is the level of respect that develops between student and teacher. For kids to really grow as learners and citizens, the teachers must have a solid understanding of the child as both a person and a learner. Knowing and understanding where a student is as a learner is the critical on-going process towards guiding that child in sustained growth. Mutual respect between teacher and student deepens that understanding and nurtures the growth.

We are also about a third of the way through a year that has seen many, many changes around us. We are now a Pre-K to Grade 12 district, and we have experienced some of the transition bumps that would come from that not insignificant change, including some transportation and scheduling issues. But we are overcoming those and we are moving forward. Our new Superintendent, Glenn Brand, is learning about our schools and he has spent quite of bit of time in our school getting to know our students and staff and getting an up close look at who we are as a school. That close interest in all of our schools and that effort to learn about what makes each of the schools unique in the new Region will help his leadership as we grow as a regional district.

I wrote last week that Thanksgiving has been traditionally a time to reflect. As I think back over the first third of our year, I am so impressed with the remarkable way that this amazing faculty has adjusted to so many staff changes as well as to some scheduling and process changes. We are fortunate to have the forward-thinking and flexible faculty that we have. I also think of the generous and giving parent community and how much they, too, support our vision. It is an authentic partnership and for all this we can indeed be thankful.

The Annual Lip Sync Extravaganza is scheduled for Saturday, March 7th from 4–6 PM. Due to the overwhelming popularity in recent years, a few changes are in store for the 2015 show:

- The mandatory rehearsal is scheduled for Thursday, March 3rd at 1 PM.
- Songs will be limited to 2 minutes.
- Each student is limited to ONE act.
- The same song may not be performed by multiple acts. Song choices will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.

This popular event is open to all McT students. Participants choose a song, determine to perform individually or with a group, create choreography, and perform on stage at McT. Now is the time to start thinking about a song to perform and if your child wants to perform individually or in a group. Be creative with song choices and choreography! Introduce your kids to musical genres from the 60s, 70s, and 80s, or genres such as Country, Broadway musicals or international hits. PLEASE check the lyrics before students start practicing to make sure they are family-friendly and elementary school appropriate. Sometimes we think songs are okay, but when we read the lyrics, they are not suitable for young children.
