slideshow to present to prospective families that was absolutely phenomenal. There is a lot to be proud of at our school and it is fun to have so many faculty members, parents and, of course, Student Council members, all be a part of showing off who we are as a school. We can talk about how our community is indeed a large part of raising a responsible child, one who is invested in her learning. When the Student Council members can articulate so clearly what it is they do in their classrooms and how it helps them grow, socially and academically, then we know we have achieved some measure of success. In the end, it is the children who will tell us if we have succeeded in our efforts, and hearing those students speak to our visitors, I believe we are doing all the right things. The tours are a chance for people to visit and see all of this in action. The teaching in the classrooms, the hard work displayed on the walls and the interactions between kids and their teachers and all the other adults in our school all are terrific examples of who we are as a school. Thank you so much to Tracey Smith, our Parent Involvement Coordinator, Carol Chytil, our amazing Office Assistant, Astrid Trostorff, our incredible School Office Administrator, parent touring volunteers, and to the teachers who have all been part of the process of showing off our school! ## Breakfast is Important!

The most important meal of the day may be breakfast. Current research suggests that eating breakfast improves a child's learning skills, attendance, weight control, cholesterol levels and physical endurance. Breakfast-skippers often feel restless, tired and have difficulty concentrating on tasks. Despite the healthful benefits, breakfast is the meal that is most neglected. Many students, especially adolescents, do not understand the importance of finding the time to eat in the morning.

Breakfast is the first chance that the body has to "refuel." A healthy breakfast should consist of complex carbohydrates, low-fat proteins or dairy sources, and fruit. According to the American Dietetic Association, quick and easy breakfasts can include the following:

- Ready to eat cereal with fruit and milk
- Toasted bagel with cheese
- Fruit filled breakfast bars and yogurt
- Fruit smoothie (fruit and milk mixed in a blender)
- Peanut butter (if not contraindicated because of allergies) on whole wheat toast
- Oatmeal with applesauce
- Fresh fruit topped with yogurt and crispy whole grain cereal

**Who Can Come?** All McT students, along with any interested parents or young siblings.

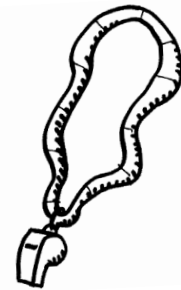
**Who is in Charge?** Dave James will be coordinating Workout Wednesday; Chris Hanlon will help and organize parent volunteers.
