The integration of the visual arts into the curriculum across the grade levels begins in Kindergarten and becomes a huge part of the student learning process as kids grow through the school. Also, ours is an environment that is about risk-taking, cooperation, and problem solving. It is a place that seeks to have families assume active roles in the school. This is part of what makes us unique in Acton and, indeed, in public education.

The pride that the faculty and staff and children take in being part of McCarthy-Towne is apparent everywhere one looks. The walls display student work, completed and still in process. Conversations in the classrooms are as lively and engaging as they are in the staff room! Families are an active part of the school through the School Council and a variety of committees. Active, community and committed are words that describe our school. This is the school we proudly invite prospective families and children to be part of as they tour the McCarthy-Towne School.

Reminders From the Office

Checking in with the Office When visiting the school please remember to stop in the Office to sign-in and take a name tag before heading to wherever you are volunteering/visiting. Priority Kindergarten Registration

The Acton Public Schools offers Early Kindergarten Registration for "Priority Admission Candidates." Siblings of students currently enrolled in Acton Public Schools who will be five years old by September 1, 2014 are given priority registration status.

Early registration will be held at R. J. Grey Junior High School on **Tuesday, January 21 from 9 AM-noon and 7-9 PM and on Wednesday, January 22 from 9 AM-noon**. Parents/guardians must bring a copy of your child's birth certificate/passport and most recent physical examination and immunization record. 2014 MCAS Schedule

Students in grades 3, 4, 5, and 6 will be taking MCAS tests this spring. Please avoid scheduling trips and appointments during the MCAS testing periods. Testing begins at the beginning of the school day, so students should avoid late arrival to school. If they arrive after their class begins the test, they will not be able to take the test that day. While the specific dates are not yet finalized, they WILL fall during the following periods:

English Language Arts Reading Comprehension (Grades 3, 4, 5, 6)

Week of March 17

(make-up tests given week of March 24)

English Language Arts Composition (Grade 4)

Week of March 17

(make-up tests given week of March 24)

Mathematics (Grades 3, 4, 5, 6)

Week of May 5

(make-up tests given week of May 12)

Science, Technology & Engineering (Grade 5)

Week of May 12

What's in a Name?

Learning in and through the arts has always been an important part of McCarthy-Towne's philosophy. Whether painting scenery, carving wooden owls, composing poetry, or performing in a Greek chorus, students have always been encouraged to find meaning in their creative expressions.

When McT was founded in 1971, students participated in a wood shop class, called Sloyd, which met every other week. Children attended in half-class groups and the program was funded by the PTSO. Throughout the years, various craftspeople were hired as consultants to teach Sloyd. Although skilled as woodworkers, being a certified teacher was not required.

As time went on and our school grew and changed, the community began to understand the importance of art education in the development of the whole child. In 2005, a weekly Visual Arts class was established at McT and the curriculum expanded to include the standards and learning goals reflected in contemporary art education.

Although the program underwent an important make-over, language often takes a bit of time to catch up, and the name Sloyd remained until this year. Today, the full-time Visual Arts program is part of the ABRSD Art Department and is taught by a certified art teacher with a Masters degree in art education. Weekly classes celebrate the wisdom of the hands and nurture the development of an artistic attitude. Children are encouraged to discover their creative capacities, feel pride in craftsmanship, and make interdisciplinary connections in all aspects of learning. In the Visual Arts studio, the hand, the heart, and the head, work together as children manipulate tools and materials, express feelings and ideas, and critically think to solve artistic challenges. Studio habits of mind, such as envisioning, observing, reflecting and persisting are practiced throughout the art-making process. Units of study include sculpture, ceramics, woodworking, drawing, painting, printmaking, weaving and mixed media.

The capacity to create and express ourselves through the arts is one of the central qualities that make us human. Art is uniquely a human language, spoken in all cultures, giving meaning to our lives. At McCarthy-Towne we believe that a child who is literate in the arts is a child eager and ready for a future in the 21st century.

Treasure Island Auction Update



Just before launching 'Auction Season', AKA "Treasure Island" this year, we would like to remind everyone WHY we hold our school auction on an annual basis. **Our auction is THE BIGGEST fundraiser at McT**, and provides 65% of the funds raised for the PTSO budget. What does the PTSO budget pay for? About 90% of the money we raise goes to Contracted Services which includes additional classroom assistants, the Parent Involvement Coordinator, the Art Integration Specialist, and additional Media Assistant and Reading Assistant hours. These all have a direct impact on our children. The remaining PTSO budget is used for Cultural and Performing Arts performances, field-trip funding assistance, and various grade-level needs (for instance, this year, 3rd grade used their money to subsidize the cost of the Eyes on Owls assembly). In a nutshell, all students, families, teachers and staff benefit from the funds raised by the PTSO.

There will be much more information to come. We welcome ALL volunteers from planners to donors, designers to art project specialists! Not to mention the hands-on help we need the day of the Auction for set up AND Auction Night for the back room! Watch for Special Auction Howlers and Friday Flyers for lots of details!
