## November Days

We have indeed been fortunate this year with inclement weather, even if we were to include this past weekend. For the last couple of years we have already had snow and not insignificant snow to greet us on a school day. But this year, we are simply experiencing the time change, where we see more of a morning and considerably less of an afternoon!

I write this as we are preparing for our Professional Learning Day, which will occur on Tuesday, November 4, Election Day. The K-2 Primary classrooms have already had two work days with our Teachers College staff developer and on our PL Day, we will be processing those days and looking ahead to the time that remains with our coaches. The processing, though, is almost as important as the presence of the coaches. This is a time for all of us, as a school, reflect on the work that we are doing in literacy. One of the goals that we are working on is the concept of metacognition, which is getting kids to employ multiple strategies as they tread: decoding, thinking about the meaning of the text, using illustration, etc. All of this is in the service of making meaning from the text.

But reading is also a wonderful, joyful activity, one that can bring kids to many places. Reading with your children, reading to your children and listening to your children read is a big part of bringing the classroom home. Newspapers, cookbooks and even the back of a cereal box are all

resources at your fingertips, too. Families who read together send the message that reading is a joyful experience and joyful learning is what school is about.

I recently had the pleasure of accompanying the Fifth Grade to a wonderful place, Merrowvista. Each October, the Fifth Grade travels to a tiny town in the hills of New Hampshire to visit an environmental teaching camp called Merrowvista. It is a remarkable adventure, one that has become part of being at school at McCarthy-Towne. As fourth graders, the kids look forward to it, and, for the rest of their time at McT, they remember it. At this incredible place, our students are encouraged to consider the challenges around them and to set new goals for themselves, goals that will push their thinking about themselves. But our kids are also encouraged to think about themselves as individuals within a community of others and how personal actions can have an impact on the group as a whole. This they can bring back to school and they do. The idea of Merrowvista stays with them for the rest of Fifth Grade and beyond.

Schools teach about the critical elements of being part of a community as well as the important academic elements across the content areas. McCarthy-Towne has always been proud of the way that we make this clear to children and of our successes in both arenas. Thanks to all of you who are part of this wonderful school community and for your support!

## Food Service Department Update

Are you looking for a part time job in the schools with mother's hours? We are looking for Food Service Substitutes. Please contact Kirsten Nelson (978-264-4700 x 3221) if interested.

We have had a busy start to the school year! We are happy to serve your children lunch every day! For those of you that are new to the school system we would like to take this opportunity to let you know about our Sunday evening automated calls. If your child's balance on Sunday is below zero you will receive a call letting you know the balance. If your child has a positive balance between \$.01 and \$5.00 you will receive a call letting you know you have a positive balance and it is getting low. If you do not wish to receive a call on Sunday evenings from the Food Service Department we suggest you keep more than \$5.01 on your child's lunch account.

We do not send home invoices. The automated call is our way of reaching out to you to let you know your child's balance. There are occasions when a student's account is above \$5.01 on a Sunday (you will not receive a call), the account can still go in the negative over the course of the week. If you have a ParentOnline account, you have the ability to set up a low balance alert. By setting up a low balance alert you will receive an e-mail notification if your balance is below the threshold you set up for the alert. (Example: notify me when the balance gets below \$10.) You also have the ability to set up an automatic payment once your balance gets below a certain amount. Or you can send in cash or check with your child.

If you would like to set up a low balance alert or an automatic payment for your child's lunch account visit ParentOnline at [www.parentonline.net/Public/Login](http://www.parentonline.net/Public/Login).

If you would like to pay by check or cash, please fill out the payment form. Visit [www.abschools.org/departments/food-services/lunch-prepayment](http://www.abschools.org/departments/food-services/lunch-prepayment). You can use one form for all of your children.

Additionally, if you have an account in ParentOnline please remember to update your credit card information (check expiration dates) as well as update your automatic payment settings. The automatic payment settings are valid for one year from the time you set up your payment. Automatic payment settings need to be updated each year.
